

1. Description and Introduction:

The Canadian Federation of Medical Students (CFMS) is the representative voice of Canadian medical students to the national medical organizations, to the federal government, to the public, and to other external bodies. The CFMS represents over 8000 medical students at 15 Canadian medical schools from coast to coast. It is the mission of CFMS to represent, support, and connect its members. CFMS aims to communicate within its membership, as well as from its membership, to the world at large. As an ever-expanding organization, CFMS continually strives to meet the consistent and changing needs of Canadian medical students.

Brief Description

The CFMS Global Health Director is responsible for representing the global health interests of the CFMS member schools and the CFMS. Global Health within the CFMS is at a transition point and currently has seven different portfolios:

- Exchanges
- Human rights and peace
- Reproductive and sexual health
- Global health education
- Public Health
- Partnerships and Communications
- Health and Environment (HEART)

*Note:

- Indigenous Health was previously a portfolio and will become a CFMS Director role in the 2022 Spring General Meeting.
- Public Health is a new CFMS portfolio, but currently exists as an International Federation of Medical Student (IFMSA) portfolio
- Partnerships is combined with Communications as one joint portfolio

There are National Officers that oversee each portfolio; as well, there are Local Officers for each portfolio at each member school. The Director of Global Health oversees the Global Health Portfolio including the National Officers, Roundtables, and Task Forces. As well, the Director of Global Health represents the CFMS to the International Federation of Medical Students' Associations (IFMSA) and is the National Member Organization President for Canada within the IFMSA.

3. Priorities and Project Areas

In the 2020 Fall AGM Global Health Executive Report (<u>https://drive.google.com/file/d/1_hNWM-hkeddUDzaWA-9b1spC9DjROiPk/view?usp=sharing</u>) there were 5 project areas:

- a. Increased collaboration
- b. Increase general member engagement
- c. Enhance the Efficiency and Effectiveness of the Portfolio
- d. Clearly Outline the Role of the CFMS Within the IFMSA
- e. Positively Impact Indigenous Health within Medical School

Below on the progress on these same five priorities during the April 2021 – October 2021 period that I have been in the role:

a. Increased collaboration

- i. Between national officers
 - Check-in with all the previous national officers on advancing their prior projects
 - Held Global Health Community Meeting with national officers on July 11th to publicly share global health resources
- ii. Between global health liaisons -
 - Check-in with most university's global health liaisons to learn about local social justice initiatives. Working towards establishing central lines of easily accessible info
- iii. Within other portfolios
 - Education: held July 11th public meeting, restructured recruitment, advanced motion to raise Indigenous Health to a director role
 - Government Affairs: advanced motion to raise Indigenous Health to a director role
- iv. With other IFMSA teams -
 - Collaboration with IFMSA Québec to advance EDI student survey

b. Increase General Member Engagement

i. Held July 11th global health public meeting



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- ii. Currently restructuring global health national officer recruitment (in collaboration with Global Health Liaisons and CFMS directors) to better grassroots social justice initiatives
- iii. Collaboration with Communications director to share global health info on social media via videos and posts

c. Enhance the Efficiency and Effectiveness of the Portfolio

- i. Holding a public global health community meeting on October 22nd to receive feedback on the current Terms of Reference for all Global Health portfolio (national officer roles)
- ii. Currently restructuring recruitment of national officers to enable new national officers to update Terms of Reference with clear responsibilities in an accountable way to better support collaborations on social justice initiatives within portfolio

d. Clearly Outline the Role of the CFMS Within the IFMSA

- i. Initiated close contacts with IFMSA National Member Organizations of Venezuela, Brazil, Jamaica, Ghana, Gambia, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Australia, Philippines, Egypt, Iran. Aiding with three international initiatives:
 - Redrafting the IFMSA membership fees policy from an equity lens
 - Drafting a clear elections guideline document to increase accessibility of IFMSA leadership roles (https://docs.google.com/document/d/1Hcvdq4NIhM6bkjJjBhnuWo_qlugDN TlhtxWc5JMIHxY/edit?usp=sharing)
 - Redesigning the structure of task forces within the IFMSA
- ii. Currently facilitating more opportunities for Canadian medical students to directly collaborate with international medical students:
 - Brazil decolonizing global health conference
- iii. International Exchanges are currently on hold due to the AFMC pandemic policy.
 - Re-establishing contacts with IFMSA exchange leads and National Exchange Officers from many NMOs (France, Singapore,) to prepare for re-initiating exchanges

e. Positively Impact Indigenous Health within Medical School

- i. Drafted and passed motion for Indigenous Health national officer role to become two new director roles
- ii. Integrating Indigenous health issues into all seven global health portfolios

Grateful. I am incredibly grateful for each moment in this role that I have been able to connect and learn with medical learners who care deeply for social justice.

During these initial months, cognizant of the recent history of the Global Director role, outlined in links above, I have worked towards centering the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) calls to action in the restructuring of our global health portfolio. Furthermore, I have worked on implementing an anticolonial and decolonization framework into the portfolio's next steps, through consultation with Indigenous medical students and professionals. As a settler, I recognize that there is lot more to reflect on and to do, and look forward to building on this during the months to come, led by the TRC and by Indigenous students and leaders

I am humbled to have had the opportunity to engage in meaningful discussions with dozens of student leaders within the global health community, including colleagues without formal roles, local officers, previous national officers, global health liaisons, VPs of equity, diversity, and inclusion, previous CFMS directors, and leads in the Québec medical student network. International assemblies in July and August enabled me to connect with medical learners from across the world. I am particularly grateful for the reflective discussions about social inequities, such as vaccine disparities and workers' rights, with student leaders from nations in the Global South. Following these efforts, CFMS Canada has also received the welcome to participate in conversations on restructuring the International Federation of Medical Students' policies on membership fees, election guidelines, and task forces. These discussions align well with the anti-oppression restructuring that CFMS is pursuing this year. They also provide Canadian medical learners an abundance of opportunities to collaborate with international colleagues.

I am also deeply grateful for the patience and compassion of my fellow CFMS directors, who have supported my learning in restructuring our global health portfolio from a social justice lens.

I would like to sincerely thank all of my colleagues, collaborators and peers. As we move forward into the year, I welcome any recommendations, questions and concerns from learners with regards to the restructuring of our portfolio, centering anti-oppression, and next steps.
